

# The Truth About Christ's Superiority John 3:31-36

#### I. Believe Christ's transcendence (31).

# A. Christ is heavenly (31a).

- 1. Christ comes from above (31a).
- 2. Christ is above all (31a).

# B. Man is earthly (31b).

- 1. John is from the earth (31b).
- 2. John is frail (31b).
- 3. John is finite (31c).

#### II. Believe Christ's testimony (32-34).

#### A. Christ's testimony is genuine (32a, 34).

- 1. Christ's testimony is true (32a).
- 2. Christ's testimony is divine (34a).
- 3. Christ's testimony is infinite (34b).

#### B. Christ's testimony confronts man (32b-33).

- 1. Unbelievers reject Christ's testimony (32b).
- 2. Believers attests the validity of Christ's testimony (33).

# III. Believe Christ's treasure (35-36).

# A. Christ is supreme (35).

- 1. God the Father loves His Son (35a).
- 2. God gives Christ all authority (35b).

# B. Christ is the Savior (36).

- 1. The believer has salvation (36a).
- 2. The unbeliever does not have salvation (36b).
- 3. The unbeliever experiences God's wrath (36c.



### Man's Tendency of Confusion in the Midst of Suffering Job 21:1-34

- I. Man expresses his confusion about the circumstances in life (1-6).
  - A. Job desires silence (1-3).
  - B. Job desires pity (4-6).
- II. Man expresses his confusion about the prosperity of the wicked (7-16).
  - A. Job believes the wicked prosper (7-13).
  - B. Job believes the wicked are ungodly (14-16).
- III. Man expresses his confusion about God's judgement of the wicked (17-26).
  - A. Job thinks that the wicked escape judgement (17-21).
  - B. Job thinks that God randomly chooses who prospers (22-26).
- IV. Man expresses his confusion about the fate of the wicked (27-34).
  - A. Job exposes the confusion of his friends (27-33).
  - B. Job expresses frustration with his friends' confusion (34).
