

The Truth About Worship John 4:20-26

I. God desires personal worship (20-21).

A. Man confuses personal worship with a given location (20):

- 1. The Samaritan woman mentions a worship controversy (20).
 - 2. The Samaritan woman uses this controversy as a distraction (20).

B. Christ explains that personal worship is a lifestyle (21).

- 1. Personal worship is not limited to a location (21).
- 2. Personal worship is not limited to a particular event (21).

II. God delineates proper worship (22).

A. Christ exposes man's need of proper worship (22a).

- 1. Christ exposes the woman's lack of knowledge of what she worships (22a).
- 2. Christ exposes the woman's lack of knowledge of proper worship (22a).

B. Christ explains the details of proper worship (22b).

- 1. Christ explains the Jews' knowledge of proper worship (22b).
- 2. Christ explains the foundation of proper worship (22c).

III. God demands pleasing worship (23-26).

A. God desires genuine worshippers (23-24).

- 1. God desires genuine worship. (23a)
- 2. God desires right worship. (23a)
- 3. God defines a genuine worshipper (23b-24).

B. God desires genuine knowledge (25-26).

- 1. The Samaritan woman demonstrates head knowledge (25).
- 2. Christ desires the Samaritan woman to have heart knowledge (26).



Why do the Wicked Prosper? Job 24:1-25

- I. The wicked oppress the righteous (1-12).
 - A. Man thinks that God is uncaring (1-8).
 - B. Man thinks that God is unaware (9-12).
- II. The wicked escape immediate judgment (13-17).
 - A. The wicked commit terrible crimes (13-17).
 - B. The wicked commit terrible crimes secretly (13-17).
- III. The wicked faces God's future judgment (18-25).
 - A. Man remembers that God will judge the wicked (18-22, 24-25).
 - B. Man remembers that God knows the acts of the wicked (23).
